

REGULATION
on the organization of refereeing at the International Contest
"Road Patrol"

I. General Provisions

1. With a view to organize an objective refereeing in the course of the Contest, this Regulation determines the order of relations among referees, their rights, duties and other issues relating to referee activity during the Contest.

2. The official languages of the Contest are the Russian and English languages. In the co-organizer country's territory the main language is the national language.

3. Refereeing is carried out by the Judge Panel in accordance with the Regulation on the Contest.

The composition of the Judge Panel of the Contest:

The chief referee of the Contest;

The deputy chief referee of the Contest;

The secretary of the Judge Panel;

Interpreters (if necessary);

The referees on the route - 8 persons;

The chief referee at the shooting range;

The referee at the shooting range;

The referee-experts - 2 persons (from the agency responsible for monitoring of compliance with traffic rules at the state level);

The referees on trials - 4 persons (2 of them are specialists in medical training and firefighting service);

Referee-commentator;

Referee-timekeeper;

Referee-starter.

Personal composition of the Judge Panel is approved by the authorized officer of the organizer (co-organizer) defensive department on a submission from the Chief referee but not less than two days before the Contest.

4. In the case of a shortage of the referees for any reasons related to the peculiarity of the route of individual or team races, an increase in the composition of the Judge Panel is permitted.

5. The composition of the Judge Panel also includes a coach or a technical worker from the team participating in the Contest. At the request of the participating country, the Judge Panel may include a specialist (a serviceman, who has an appropriate education or a category) in the field of road traffic safety and arrived as a part of the delegation (operational team) with the team.

Chiefs of teams participating in the Contest cannot be a part of the Judge Panel.

If due to the circumstances a chief of a team is involved in refereeing (at a lack of referees), he has the only right to an advisory vote without the right to participate in the decision making on protests.

6. The Judge Panel of the Contest is headed by the chief referee of the Contest. No other Judge Panels are created. The Contest organizer (co-organizer) cannot influence the decision of the Judge Panel and does not participate in its work.

The chief referee of the competition is appointed by the authorities of the defensive department of the host country.

7. Principles of refereeing:

impartiality;

publicity;

democratic character;

common evaluation strategy of the results;

collegiality;

objectivity;

fairness;

tolerance;

transparency.

8. The number of members of the Judge Panel should be odd. Interpreters have no voting right.

9. Tasks of the Judge Panel:

ensuring the planned course of the Contest in accordance with the approved program;

creation of objectively equal conditions ensuring fair conduct of the Contest by the Contest participants, as well as observance of ethical norms and moral requirements imposed on them;

fulfillment of the conditions of the Contest program and the procedure for determining individual (team) results;

full compliance with the rules of the Contest and established security requirements;

ensuring objectivity in determining the winners;

determination of the winners of the Contest competition and the Contest in whole on the basis of the results obtained, approved by the chief referee of the Contest after an open vote by a majority of the Judge Panel votes;

consideration of protests (appeals) on the order and rules of the Contest or the results of their participants.

10. **The Judge Panel has the right** to demand from the Contest organizer (co-organizer) the creation of objective and equal conditions in competitions for all team members. The decision of the Judge Panel on the creation of objective and equal conditions in the Contest is mandatory for the organizer (co-organizer) responsible for conducting this Contest.

This Regulation is verified in writing after reviewing by chiefs of teams of the Contest participating countries, thereby confirming their consent for unconditional leadership of the rules unified for all Contest participants.

Amendments to this Regulation may be made by a decision of the Judge Panel of the Contest after an open vote with a majority of votes.

11. Under the chairmanship of the chief referee of the Contest the Judge Panel conducts briefings and determines in the course of it:

daily work schedule of the Judge Panel;

general procedure for determining the rating of participants and national teams, consideration of controversial issues received from venues of the Contest and making decisions on it;

interaction issues with a chief of the Judge Panel of the Games and media representatives.

12. At least two days the start of the Contest the Judge Panel:

checks the readiness of teams, armament of automotive vehicle, educational base for competitions. Received information is drawn up in a protocol;

holds a briefing with media representatives where he informs about the Contest program as well as other necessary issues, if necessary.

II. Duties of the Members of the Judge Panel

13. **The Chief Referee of the Contest** is subordinated to the chief referee of the Games and heads the work of the entire Judge Panel of the Contest.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest;

to head the work of the Judge Panel;

to approve additional duties of the officials of the Judge Panel on presentation by the deputy chief referee of the Contest and monitor its implementation;

to conduct briefing meetings of the Judge Panel, give instructions on the main issues of refereeing before the start of the Contest and, if necessary;

to know the program of the Contest and the schedule of the Contest day, monitor its implementation;

to control the completeness of training and equipment of obstacles to the route of the military-technical relay race and other venues for the Contest, places for trials and shooting, specially equipped platforms, facilities for the work of the commission, readiness of equipment, inventory and weapons, the availability of award material, and approve the act acceptance of all the facilities of the Contest;

to notify timely the team leaders of the Contest about all changes in the Contest and explain the reasons;

to hold meetings to summarize the results of the competitions and to approve the overall results of the competition, to check the correctness of the team and individual results;

to have a sleeve referee insignia (band) with a Contest emblem;

to check educational base status (route of the Contest), recorders, special equipment and its readiness for competitions, readiness of field referees as well as real status of armament, automotive vehicle and ammunition, availability of reports on its mechanical condition before the start of the Contest together with members of the Judge Panel with the assistance of appropriate specialists;

to give lectures on security requirements with all participants of the Contest;

to conduct credentials commission and of the readiness of the Contest participants, to check during the inspection on personal documents conformity of participants of the Contest with nominal lists given by chefs of teams in applications, their knowledge of the Regulation on the Contest and equipment;

to conduct the draw;

to consider applications and protests and personally submit it for the discussion of the Judge Panel;

to approve the results of the competition and the Contest in whole, the list of participants of the Contest with final protocols and report (submit) it to the chief referee of the Games;

not allow the team to compete in case of violation of the requirements of the Regulation on the Contest;

to investigate violations of security requirements immediately, to take measures to prevent them together with the deputy chief of staff of the administration for the service of troops and security of the military service;

to bring the results of the competition to representatives of the mass media and the public.

The chief referee is responsible for the organization of the refereeing and the quality of the work of the Judge Panel. The evaluation of the work of the members of the Judge Panel is given at the final meeting.

On each application and protest the senior referee personally approves the decision of the judicial commission on the merits of the matter.

The Chief Referee of the Contest **has the right**:

to stop the competition (challenge), if there are conditions that prevent it from being carried out, as well as the preconditions for violation of security requirements;

to move referees in the course of the Contest, if necessary,;

to remove referees from the refereeing who committed rough errors, nonobjective refereeing, or who do not cope with the performance of the duties assigned to them;

to cancel decisions of separate referees, which contradict the Regulation on the Contest.

14. The Deputy of the Chief Referee of the Contest is subordinated to the chief referee of the Contest.

He is obliged to follow the instructions of the chief referee of the Contest, and in the absence of a chief referee, perform his duties;

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest;

to check the compliance of the elements of the trials performed to the requirements of the guidelines and the Regulation on the Contest;

to check the readiness of the training places before the beginning of each competition;

to inform the entire personnel of the units on ceasefire signals during the shooting exercises and signals to stop the trials;

in case of violations of security requirements, immediately stop the execution of the trial and report to the chief referee;

to check the readiness and compliance of models of weapons and military equipment, established by operational requirements before the start of the competition;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee.

15. The Secretary of the Judge Panel is subordinated to the chief referee (the deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

He is responsible for recording the results, keeping the minutes and documentation of the Judge Panel.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest;

to keep records of the trials results of the Contest and the Contest in a whole;

to draw up protocols on the results of competitions and Contest, to sign it by the members of the Judge Panel, to approve through the deputy chief referee by the chief referee of the Contest and to acquaint the team heads with it (to transfer copies);

to inform the interim and final results to the headquarters of the Games through the corresponding representative of the Contest;

to take protests, as well as any other applications, forward them to the chief referee of the Contest;

to draw up, sign by the chief referee of the Contest and to inform the applicants on replies to the protests (applications), based on the results of the Judge Panel meetings,;

to draw up additional protocols to clarify the order of the competition and the criteria for its evaluation, based on the results of the Judge Panel meetings;

to be at the control and management place during the competition;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee).

16. An Interpreter is subordinated to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest and is responsible for accurate and timely informing of all decisions of the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest;

to know colloquial and technical English language;

to be always near the chief referee of the Contest;

timely and accurately inform the heads of teams of foreign states or their interpreters all decisions of the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

17. The Referee on the Route is subordinated to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest and is responsible for monitoring the correctness of the participants passing through the entrusted area on the route.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest;

to check the compliance of the elements of the entrusted section of the route with the requirements of the guidelines and the Regulation on the Contest in so far as it relate to;

to inform all Contest participants of the signals of the correct (incorrect) passage of the route section, as well as the termination of movement;

to ensure the maintenance of the entrusted site during the competition in accordance with the requirements of the guidelines and the Regulation on the Contest;

in case of violation of safety requirements, immediately stop the vehicle and report to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) by means of communication;

about all errors, immediately submit the established signals and report by means of communication;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

18. The Chief Referee at the Shooting Range is subordinated to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest and is responsible for compliance with security requirements, giving commands and conducting firing.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest insofar as it relates;

to check the readiness and compliance of the equipment of the location of the trial with the requirements of the guidelines and the Regulation on the Contest;

to inform the entire personnel of the units on the ceasefire signals during the shooting exercises;

in case of violation of security requirements, immediately stop the trial, submit the established signal by means of communication and report to the chief referee (deputy chief referee);

to check the readiness and compliance of the weapons models with the established operational requirements before the shooting starts;

to ensure the work of the operator of the target field and the recording of the results of the shooting;

immediately report by means of communication about all errors and report to the chief referee (deputy chief referee);

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

19. The Referee at the Shooting Range is subordinated to the chief referee at the shooting range and is responsible for compliance with security requirements at the shooting range, giving commands and conducting of firing.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest insofar as it relates;

to check the conformity of the equipment of the trial site with the requirements of the guidelines and the Regulation on the Contest;

to inform the entire personnel of the units on the ceasefire signals during the shooting exercises;

in case of violation of security requirements, immediately stop the trial and report to the chief referee at the shooting range;

to check the readiness and compliance of the weapon models with the established operational requirements before the trials;

to ensure the work of the operator of the target field and the recording of the results of the shooting;

as for all mistakes immediately report to the chief referee at the shooting range;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee at the shooting range;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

20. The Referee-Expert is subordinated to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest and is responsible for monitoring the trials that require special training.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest insofar as it relates;

to check the readiness and conformity of the venues for the competitions (trials) to the requirements of the guidelines and the Regulation on the Contest insofar as it relates;

to inform the entire personnel on specific errors during the conduct of the competition;

in case of violation of security requirements, immediately stop trials, submit an established signal and report to the chief referee by means of communication;

to fix all mistakes and after the competition give the signed forms to the secretary of the Judge Panel;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

21. The Referee in Trial is subordinated to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest and is responsible for the exact fulfillment by participants of the Contest of security requirements, established order, and trial conditions. All officials appointed to supervise the conduct of the trial are subordinated to him.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest;

to check the conformity and readiness of the elements of the trials to be carried out with the requirements of the guidelines and the Regulation on the Contest insofar as it relates;

to check the readiness of places for trials;

to inform the participants on the signals of the correct (incorrect) performance of the trial, as well as the termination of the trial;

in case of violation of security requirements, immediately stop the trial and report by means of communications to the chief referee (deputy chief referee);

about all mistakes immediately report by means of communication to the chief referee (the deputy chief referee);

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

22. The Referee-Commentator is subordinated to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest and is responsible for covering the events and results of the Contest competitions.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest;

to have a clear and trained voice;

to develop questionnaires for the personnel of the teams, to compile the information about them and bring them to the audience during the Contest;

to highlight continually events taking place in the venue of the competition;

to ensure the presence of a sound technician with sound equipment necessary for the entire period of the Contest, including rehearsals of the opening and closing ceremonies;

to check the soundness of sound equipment right before the start of the event;

to summarize the results of the competition and the Contest in a whole, to tell about prize-winners in a particular competition;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

23. The Referee-Timekeeper is subordinated to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest and is responsible for the timing of the competition.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing of the Contest;

to have serviceable, checked up stopwatches (at least three);

to keep the timing of the time in trials and competitions, transmit the trials results immediately by radio;

to stop (continue) the timing of the competition (trial) at the command of the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

24. The Referee-Starter is subordinated to the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest and is responsible for the submission of the "start" and "finish" commands during the trials.

He is obliged:

to know the Regulation on the Contest and the Regulation on the refereeing on the Contest;

to have a black and white flag in size 50x50 for giving commands and "finish", as well as a whistle (the starting gun is allowed to give a "start" command);

to inform the Contest participants on the order of giving commands "start" and "finish" with the help of a flag (the starting gun is allowed additionally);

when a false start, give a signal to stop the competition, report by means of communication to the chief referee (deputy chief referee);

to show the direction of the movement of the car and the participant, if necessary;

to perform other tasks as directed by the chief referee (deputy chief referee) of the Contest.

III. Organization of Refereeing

25. The work of the Judge Panel commences with the determination of the quorum (at least 70% of the referees) and the approval of the agenda. A member of the Judge Panel can give an oral (written) remark or a proposal on a particular issue on the agenda. To the member of the Judge Panel who proposed the inclusion of specific issues on the agenda, the opportunity to substantiate his position should be given. Decisions on the inclusion of proposals submitted to the agenda of the commission and the procedure for its work are adopted by open voting on each proposal by a simple majority of the members of the Judge Panel participating in the voting.

In case of equality of votes the Judge Panel makes decisions on the priority of the deciding vote of the chief referee or by the final decision of the chief of the Contest referee excluding him from voting by members of the Judge Panel.

26. A team representative may submit proposals for the replacement of a referee appointed by him if he cannot perform his duties for objective reasons (illness, etc.). Replacement of the referee is conducted no more than once during the Contest.

27. The chief of a team applies for the team participation in the Contest by the form established by the Regulation on the refereeing of the Games where the composition of a team is written.

28. After consideration of applications for the participation of a team in competitions, a protocol of admission to the Contest is drawn up, that is signed by the members of the Judge Panel and approved by the chief referee of the Contest.

29. The chief of the team has the right to apply to the Judge Panel on the disputed issue. In case of a negative decision, the applicant can apply with the appropriate application to the Judge Panel of the Games.

At its meetings, on the application of chiefs of members of competitions the Judge Panel of the Contest considers disputed issues on the organization and progress of the Contest, and also keeps records of the interim results, on the basis of which the rating of the national teams in the contest is drawn up.

30. All results remain preliminary until the checklists of the field referees are checked up. The results of the contest are drawn up in a protocol, signed by the

Judge Panel and approved by the chief referee of the Contest. The referee who refuses to sign the protocol must indicate the reason at the end of the protocol.

31. In case of disagreement in the resolution of issues during the Contest, the final decision is made by voting of the senior Judge Panel of the Games, which is not subject to discussion and appeal.

32. When considering disputes related to the use of weapons and automotive vehicle, expert groups (an expert) from the host side may be invited. Testing is allowed to determine the real value of the characteristics and the, if necessary. If the participating country arrived with its weapons and automotive vehicle, a chief of a team provides manuals for weapons and automotive vehicle with all performance characteristics and with translation into Russian and English (into the national language, if the Contest is held in the co-organizer country).

33. With officials, appointed to the Judge Panel of the Contest, seminars will be organized during the reconnaissance of competition venues on the territory of the organizers (co-organizers of the competitions), including at least three days before the start of the competition.

IV. Features of Refereeing

34. The Contest, interrupted for technical reasons, weather conditions or other circumstances should be continued or completed the same day. If it is not possible, the Contest will be postponed to the next day by the decision of the chief referee of the Contest. The results of the previous day are taken into account.

During the Contest the weather conditions should be the same for all the teams (participants) and by the petition of a chief of a team the Contest can be temporarily suspended by the decision of the chief referee.

35. The uniform for the Judge Panel, as a rule, is summer, field with armbands and reflective waistcoats (if necessary) with the symbols of the Games.

36. In the case of the occurrence of preconditions for violation of security requirements (force majeure circumstances) capable of influencing the final results of the Contest, the chief referee of the Contest stops the competition (trial) for all teams on the route, with the stop of the time for the passage of the route for all teams, until the creation of safe conditions for the continuation of the Contest. After eliminating the reasons for the stop of the competition (trial) at the command of the chief referee of the Contest, the countdown resumes.

A team (participant) of the contest, who (admitted) a rough violation of security requirements, which could be a reason for injury, is removed from the competition by the decision of the chief referee of the Contest.

37. All participants of the contest have to undergo a medical examination before the start of each day of the competition. Participants, who did not undergo a medical examination, are not allowed to participate in the competition.

38. The order of the performance of teams and participants of the Contest is determined by the draw.

The draw is held in the form of ceremony before the start of the Contest by the Judge Panel of the Contest in the presence of members of teams and mass media.

The personnel stand in line or are located in a classroom.

In front of the line (of the classroom) there is a table with an opaque bag (container) for the draw. The content of the bag (container) is showed to all participants of the draw.

The chief of each team draws a token from the opaque bag (container) indicating the order of heat or the order of the performance of his team. The order of heat and performance of the team is determined on the same day by the commander (chief) of the team and presented to the secretary of the Contest during the draw.

The results of the draw are drawn up by protocols, signed by the Judge Panel of the Contest, approved by the chief referee of the Contest and sent to the chief referee of the Games through the representative of the Contest at the headquarters of the Games.

All personnel participating in the draw is informed about the results of the draw after approval.

After the draw the floor is given to the commander (chief) of each team. After that the teams are invited for a friendly “battle of views”, after which each team pronounces the name of the team and the motto (call) they are going to follow during the competition. The team can be presented using props.

“Battle of views”, the name of the team and its motto (call) are an essential (obligatory) part of the draw ceremony.

It is also possible to pronounce mottos on the opening and closing ceremony of the Contest during the presentation of teams.

The draw ceremony ends with photographing.

39. In the course of preparation for the competition, inspection of the venue of the competitions (trials), in the case of disagreements regarding the organization, the order of the contest and refereeing, it is possible to specify the order of organization, holding the contest and refereeing. The decision is made by the protocol and signed by the members of the Judge Panel, the commander (chiefs) of the teams and approved by the chief referee of the Contest. The protocol is drawn up in several copies by the number of participating teams.

40. Before the start of the competition (trial) the Judge Panel explains and shows the boundaries of the competitions (trials) that are forbidden to cross by the participants of the teams, with the exception of next participants, representatives of the media, spectators and support personnel.

V. Final results protocols

41. After the end of the Contest before the final meeting, the chief referee of the Contest together with the deputy chief referee and the secretary of the Judge Panel, makes a report, which reflects the following sections: general data (name of the contest, terms, place and conditions of holding it); information on the participants of the Contest (names of participating teams and their number, age); results of competitions; protests and decisions on them; discipline of participants (violations of military discipline, the schedule of competitions, the legislation of the host country); the state of the material base and the quality of medical care;

compliance with safety requirements; evaluation of the work of the Judge Panel, representatives of the teams; general conclusion with indication of disadvantages in the organization and holding of the contest and proposals for the implementation of measures aimed at improving the conditions in preparation for the next contest. Final results' protocols are prepared and signed (in English and Russian language (in the national language on the territory of co-organizer countries), which are immediately announced (published). They can be reflected on a specially equipped display (board).

42. On the eve of the closing ceremony of the Contest, the final meeting of the Judge Panel is held together with the chiefs of teams, members of the organizing committee where the results of the Contest are summarized. Summarizing includes: approval of the rating based on the final protocols; evaluation of the quality of the activity of the Judge Panel, team leaders, attendants and other persons responsible for the preparation and realization of the Contest (positive and negative aspects are noted); preparedness and organization of teams, their behavior during the Contest are evaluated (if necessary).

VI. The procedure for submitting protests, proposals (applications)

43. The protest for the results of competitions of the Contest (decision) of the Judge Panel is submitted by the commander (chief) of the team of the Contest in writing in Russian and English (in the national language in the co-organizer country), no more than one hour after the end of the competition, before approval of conforming results of the competition (trial) of the Contest. In any case the commander (chief) of the team shall personally notify the secretary of the Judge Panel of his attention to submit a protest in advance.

The protest is written for the name of the chief referee of the Contest and submitted to the secretary of the Judge Panel of the Contest.

The protest in an arbitrary form indicates the content of the disputed issue, the time and place of the disputed results of the competition, the actions (decisions) that require consideration by the Judge Panel of the Contest, with the application of photo and video materials fixing the disputed results.

When deciding on a protest, the Judge Panel, in the presence of the commanders (chiefs) of the teams, has to listen to the explanations of the person, who submitted the protest and the person against whom the protest was submitted. In case of non-appearance of interested parties, the decision can be taken in absentia.

Resolutions on protests are taken by open vote by a majority of votes of the members of the Judge Panel of the Contest who are present at the meeting.

If the number of votes is equal, that half has the advantage where the chief referee of the Contest is.

A decision made by the Judge Panel of the Contest, by which the applicant is not satisfied, may be lodged with a similar protest to the Judge Panel of the Games.

44. On the issues related to the organization of the Contest, an oral or written statement may be made to the representative of the Contest organizer (co-organizer) through the head of the Contest secretariat.

The statement is made by the representative (chief) of the team orally during the Contest, no later than one hour after the event that caused the dissatisfaction.

If an oral statement cannot be resolved on the spot and will require further analysis, the team representative (chief) must state his request in a justified written protest in an arbitrary form.

45. The Judge Panel reviews the protests, influencing the results of the competition for the day of the contest, on the same day, but not later than the approval of the protocol of the Contest competition held.

The decision of the Judge Panel is considered to be accepted, if there is a quorum and at least 70% of the commission members participate in the work, it must be formalized by the protocol and notified to the applicant.

Referees have the right to announce only the collegial decision of the Judge Panel formalized by the protocol. After the decision is made, the chief referee of the Contest cannot express his point of view on the disputable issues.

Taken decision is final and binding for all participants of the Contest, except in case of application to the senior Judge Panel of the Games.

VII. Penalties

46. Encouragements.

For active and impeccable fulfillment of referee duties, the following types of rewards for referees are established:

awarding with diplomas, certificates as well as memorable gifts established by the organizer of the Contest;

recommendation to departmental awards and encouragements according to established procedure, including material encouragement.

47. Penalties.

For violation of the Contest rules or unethical behavior of a referee any member of the team can be punished by removing one point from the team result of one of competitions the day the accident happened.

The unethical behavior means: disregard of the referee's instructions; disrespectful address to the referee; touching the referee; bad language and abusive gestures; hindrance to the evaluation of team actions; delay of the Contest (competition).

48. The team, whose representative interferes into the activity of the referee brigade, demonstrates dissatisfaction with the refereeing or shows unethical behavior related to the violation of the current law of the state, where the Contest is held, shall be reprimanded, warned or disqualified.

The team can receive one reprimand and two warnings during a competition. After the third warning the team is disqualified.

In especially serious cases of violation of the rules of the Contest the Judge Panel may disqualify a violator (team) (for rude violation of safety requirements resulting in injury).

Only the chief referee of the Contest has the right to disqualify and exempt a team from the competition after an open vote of the Judge Panel with registration of the protocol.

49. For failure to perform duties, incorrect performance of refereeing duties or other violations to the referees may be applied the following types of penalties:
warning;
exemption from the competition refereeing;
disqualification with the established period of its validity.

50. The decisions to impose penalties against referees are made collectively by the Judge Panel by means of an open vote by a majority of the Judge Panel with registration of the protocol.

THE ROAD PATROL

Military Automobile Inspectorate Contest

LOCATION:

Noginsk city, Moscow region

STAGES:

1. Specialists competitions:

- Extreme driving with the implementation methods of counter emergency training by the car.
- Individual race by the car on the designated route.
- Traffic regulation by the traffic wand and by hands (individual competition outside the teams' classification).
- Acceleration and emergency braking.
- Wheel replacement (competitions of technical workers).
- Extreme parallel car parking (competition of the team chiefs).

2. Military-technical relay race (team race).

EQUIPMENT

Performance characteristics of the domestic vehicle:

Volume of the engine is 1.6 liters;

Engine power is 106 horsepower;

Mechanical gearbox.

When performing by the samples of equipment of its own, tactical and technical performance characteristics shall not exceed characteristics of the specified vehicle.

TEAM COMPOSITION (9 PERSONS)

- Commander of the team (senior officer);
- Coach (officer);
- Chief of the team (senior officer);
- Participants - 3 persons (junior officers, warrant officers, sergeants and soldiers);
- Technical personnel - 2 persons (warrant officers, sergeants and soldiers);
- Interpreter.

SPECIALISTS COMPETITIONS

MISSION

Determination of teams having the best specialists.

COMPETITION 1: EXTREME DRIVING WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION METHODS OF COUNTER EMERGENCY TRAINING BY THE CAR

CONDITIONS

Participants shall demonstrate the methods of extreme driving with the implementation of counter emergency training elements for a time record.

The participants shall have two attempts. The best time result is scored.

ELEMENTS

- Speed passing of the "snake" element by forward and backward direction.
- Overall corridor, while back and forward passing.
- "Escape turn" (180 degrees turn while back passing).
- Overall enclosure.
- Overall eight.

PENALTIES

- Dimmed headlights are not turned on.
- Violation of safety requirements when performing an element.
- Paintwork damages of the vehicle.
- Driving with unfastened seat belt.
- Temporary loss of control of the car, which caused the side skidding (drift) of the car, except the cases of side skidding (drift), which are necessary for high-speed passage of turns.
- Going beyond designated routes of the platform.
- Limiters touching (knocking down).

COMPETITION 2: INDIVIDUAL RACE

CONDITIONS

Individual race is carried out by the vehicle along the established route (2 laps) along an asphalt road with obstacles and passing tests being equipped (bulletproof vest, steel helmet, belt with a pistol holster) and with weapons (pistol, assault rifle fixed on the spot front passenger seat).

OBSTACLES

1. Cross slope.
2. Overpass.
3. Hill.
4. Railway crossing.
5. Limited travel (snake, overall corridor).

MISSIONS

1. Performing shooting exercises with the pistol "Shooting against appearing targets from the standing, kneeling and lying positions", the distance to targets is 50, 35 and 25 m, 3 growth targets, 3 bullets (during the first lap) and with the assault rifle "Shooting against appearing targets from the lying position", distance to targets 200 and 150 meters, 2 growth targets in one line, 12 bullets.

2. Platform for the first aid of the wounded as a result of a conditional road traffic accident (during the first lap).

3. Platform for extinguishing a fire that has arisen as a result of a conditional traffic accident (during the second lap).

The length of the route is 3.5 km.

PENALTIES

Departure for the traffic route with the included special lighting devices, inappropriate conditions; leaving the vehicle's door open while passing the tests and passing the relay race; fastening (unfastening) a seat belt during movement of the vehicle; touching (hitting, knocking down) safety cones and bumpers; jamming of the engine on the overpass or while driving; hitting the obstacles (stumps, stones, trees, etc.); shooting from the pistol without changing the position of the participant; missed target (targets) while firing; stopping behind the "STOP" sign while driving through the railway crossing; stopping behind the line (cones) on the overpass; performing of tests on extinguishing fire and rendering the first aid without using special lighting devices or without enclosing the vehicle with safety cones; incorrect first aid treatment, incomplete fire extinguishing.

COMPETITION 3: TRAFFIC REGULATION AT THE SIMULATED CROSSROADS

CONDITIONS

The participant shall demonstrate the knowledge and correct procedures for the practical implementation of the signals list to control traffic by the referees command, the traffic wand (flags) skills technique (mastery), the signals performance of the traffic controller and to observe the individual safety measures

in the traffic control.

The competition is not scored in the team standings.

The best controller (one) from each team is determined in the competition.

PENALTIES

- Violation of the uniform.
- Violation of individual safety measures when reaching road intersection and leaving it.
- Failure to follow up "Attention" signal when changing the position of a traffic controller or when changing the signal of a traffic controller.
- Incorrect (partial) carrying out of the referee's command.
- Incorrect signal of regulator.

COMPETITION 4: ACCELERATION AND EMERGENCY BRAKING

CONDITIONS

The participant shall accelerate the car over 80 km/h in the overall corridor 150 m long at the command of the judge, perform emergency braking so that the front bumper does not cross the nearest limit of the stop line at the finish and is not more than 50 cm from it.

Starting position: the participant is sitting in the car with running engine, the parking brake is on, a neutral gear is engaged on the gearbox, the dimmer headlights are on, the seat belt is fastened, his hands are on the steering wheel.

The main evaluation criteria are: the speed is more than 80 km/h at the distance of 120 meters from the start and the distance after stopping is not more than 50 cm up to the stop line.

Each participant has two attempts.

During the competition the participant is not allowed to fold the rear view mirrors.

PENALTIES WHICH CAUSE THE FAIL OF AN ATTEMPT:

- the seat belt is not fastened;
- emergency braking is carried out in neutral gear;
- knocking down a cone or crossing the established limits;
- stopping behind the stop line or in front of it at the distance of more than 50 cm;
- no skidding during emergency braking;
- crossing the line (120 m from the start) at the speed of less than 80 km/h;
- starting from standstill with the parking brake on;
- using more than one attempt for emergency braking;
- movement (scrolling) of rear wheels after emergency braking.

COMPETITION 5: REPLACING THE WHEEL BY TECHNICAL

PERSONNEL

CONDITIONS

Technical personnel consisting of 2 persons shall change the left rear wheel of the vehicle for a spare wheel for a time record.

By a signal of the referee the technical staff sets out a triangular safety reflector (on designated line in 15 m behind the vehicle) and starts to replace the wheel.

The standard is considered to be complied, if the wheel is replaced, jack, trench tool, triangular safety reflector, wheel chock, spare wheel and tools are accurately placed in proper locations (the vehicle's luggage compartment), and the technical staff take their places in the vehicle. The time is stopped on the clap of door's closing by the last technical person.

PENALTIES

Violation of safety requirements resulting in injury; for the period of the performance of the standard, the vehicle is not put on the parking brake; incorrectly (not installed) wheel chock for one of the front wheels; not packed (incorrectly packed) jack, trench tool, triangular safety reflector, tools or gloves (for each element); the retaining nut after replacement of a wheel is not tightened (for each nut).

COMPETITION 6: EXTREME PARALLEL PARKING BY THE VEHICLE UNDER THE COMMAND OF THE CHIEF OF THE TEAM

CONDITIONS

The competition is held by vehicles under the command of the chief of the team.

A place is designated on a flat area with white paint in the shape of a rectangle, the length of which is equal to the length of the vehicle + 1 meter, the width to the width of the vehicle is + 50 cm.

The participants have three attempts. The best result is scored.

The chief of the team is to park the vehicle in the outer perimeters of the rectangle along a convenient trajectory and by skidding of the rear axle.

It is allowed to designate a rectangle with safety cones or other objects that are convenient for determining the place for parking of the vehicle, including other vehicles or their dummies.

The team wins if the chief of the team has parked the vehicle inside the rectangle in the middle. The distance is measured between the vehicle's bumpers and the outer edges of the rectangle along, and in the case of the same results, the distances are measured across the width.

PENALTIES

The attempt is not counted if one of the external dimensions leaves the outer limits of the rectangle.

MILITARY AND TECHNICAL RELAY RACE (TEAM RACE)

MISSION

Determination of the best universal team.

THE RELAY RACE CONDITIONS

The team race is conducted along a designated route (2 laps) along an asphalt road and with obstacles and passing trials being equipped (body armor, steel helmet, belt with a holster) and with weapons (pistol, assault rifle).

Obstacles, missions and penalties are the same as in the competition of specialists – individual race.

THE TEAM RACE FEATURES:

1. Countdown shall begin from the start of the vehicle. The passing of the relay to the next participant is carried out by the passing of the traffic wand. The countdown is stopped at the finish line of the third participant.

2. Simultaneous start of two teams is allowed. In addition to the above, before the finish line parking places (pit-stops) are set up, where the participant are to serve the time penalty.

3. Penalties also include:

stopping down of the vehicle outside of the assigned area during passing of the relay;

beginning of the movement of the next team participant until he receives the " traffic wand ".

PROGRESS REVIEW

The results of competitions of the Contest are drawn up in a protocol and after approval by the chief referee of the Contest are given to the teams of the Contest.

Winners and medalists of competitions and the Contest are determined by the results of the Contest.

The results of teams and participants are displayed in the rating table. Position in the rating table of each competition, with the exception of "traffic

regulation", and of the Contest corresponds to the number of scores (for example: 10 teams (persons) participate, for the first place 10 points are awarded, for the tenth place - 1 point).

The winning team is determined by the number of scores in all competitions, except for the contest "traffic regulation".

The determination of the winner's team in each competition is determined by summing up the places occupied by the participants of the competition (for example: the team members in the competition took the 1st, 4th and 9th places, respectively the sum of the team places is 14). The team that receives the minimum amount of places receives the maximum number of points at the end of the competition and wins in it.

The team that scored the maximum number of points in all competitions is the winner of the Contest.

With the same number of points scored in all competitions of the Contest, with several teams, the team, which scored the maximum number of points in the team race (military-technical relay race) wins.

As a result of the competition of specialists, the winners in the individual standings are awarded with the following nominations:

The extreme driver.

The universal specialist.

The best regulator.

The best afterburning.

The best technical support.

The best team chief.

During the Contest, it is allowed to hold competitions outside the overall standings (volleyball, tug-of-war, "Towns" game, contest for the best song performance, arm-wrestling, etc.).

AWARDING CEREMONY

Awarding of winners and medalists of the Contest with cups and medals, awarding of winners with valuable prizes in the individual nominations is carried out in the solemn atmosphere, during the closing ceremony of the Contest.

The winners among the team are awarded: for the first place – with the challenge cup, prize medals and souvenirs; for second and third places – with prize medals and souvenirs.

The winners of individual nominations are awarded with diplomas.
